RESOLVE: Terms and Conditions

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Mission Statement

RESOLVE has been established for the first time at HMUN India 2017 to act as an educational program. RESOLVE intends to help delegates develop skills that lead to success at conference and the world beyond such as teamwork, negotiation, public speaking, research, creativity and critical thinking. These are some of the obstacles facing both veteran and novice MUN participants.

We hope that by being a part of RESOLVE, delegates will come to conference with a firmer grasp of the HMUN philosophy, and an understanding of how to make the most of their four days at conference.

Secondary to the core educational mission of the program, is a desire to build communities that will last once the conference has ended. This will add a unique dimension to the HMUN India experience and we hope will drive the spirit of diplomacy at conference.

Unlike the HMUN 101 webinar series, delegates who participate in RESOLVE will be assigned one of the Harvard staff members to mentor them in the months leading up to conference. Our staff members will design monthly assignments, and help delegates to actually apply the skills that matter most in an informal, stress-free environment.

Logistics

This program will be open only to those HMUN India delegates who have already registered for conference. No purchase is necessary to apply. However, this program will be limited to only 200 delegates who we feel will gain the most from the incredible resources provided through RESOLVE.

Delegates accepted to the program will be assigned to a group of approximately 2-4 other delegates attending conference this summer. Furthermore, accepted delegates will be assigned a Harvard mentor to offer guidance on their assignments and other Model UN questions that may arise.

Successful participants may be offered a certificate of participation upon completion of the RESOLVE program.

Assignments

Once every two weeks, delegates will be asked to complete regular assignments either on an individual or group basis. These will be completed between the months of May and July prior to conference in August.

Communication between groups will occur through Skype or email, particularly for group projects. Delegates who miss two or more assignments will be **automatically** removed from the program. More information regarding how to submit assignments will be forthcoming to the delegates that are accepted to this program.
